School Union #122's Annual Report Cards are posted on our District Website (<https://www.schoolunion122.net/>), posted on the ESEA dashboard (<https://www.maine.gov/doe/dashboard>), shared in public session at a school board meeting, and made available in the principal's office of each school. Report Cards are available for all schools that participate in standardized testing.

School Union #122 Report Cards share information regarding:

- student achievement in ELA, Math and Science
- comparisons of how our students achievement compares with state scores
- sub-groups such as Socio-Economic, Special Education, Limited English and Major Racial and Ethnic Groups
- attendance rates
- participation rates
- professional qualifications of educators in the school

Actions we are taking to improve student achievement:

- new Educator Effectiveness Systems for principals and teachers to improve teaching and learning
- improving instruction through professional development
- student Assistance Teams to address and target individual student needs
- data collection and analysis to determine and address specific student needs
- parent involvement at all levels to support and improve student achievement
